2. A minimum of 70% of the credit hours required for the degree must be earned at the college level.

3. Grade 12 academic excellence is required.

4. The following Grade 12 academic credit requirements become elective:

- Arts, Music or Theatre Arts (maximum one of these three)
- Biology
- Business Organization and Management or Introduction to Accounting or Law or Modern World Problems/World Issues (maximum one of these four).
- Chemistry
- Communications or Journalism or Media Studies (maximum one of these three)
- Comparative Religion
- Computer Education
- Economics
- Environmental Science/Environmental Studies
- French (including immersion courses)
- Geography
- Geology
- German
- History
- Latin
- Literature (Atlantic, Black, and/or Canadian, among others)
- Mathematics (NB Pre-calculus 11 or Foundations of Math 12; Pre-calculus 12A and 12B and Calculus 12; NS Academic Math 12, Advanced Math 12, Pre-calculus Math 12, NF Math 3204, or 3205 and 3207; PEI Math 621A, 621B, and/or 611B)
- Native studies
- Oceanography
- Physics
- Political Science
- Sociology
- Spanish

In addition to the above elective courses, applicants may offer the following New Brunswick courses as electives: History 112: Modern History; Geography 110: Physical Geography.

Comparable courses from other provinces or countries may also be acceptable.

Notes:

- a. Francophone applicants must offer French in place of the compulsory English course, and a grade 12 English course, as a condition of admission.
- b. Other grade 12 courses: schools wishing to have a course other than those listed above considered for admission purposes (e.g., pilot or local-option courses), should contact the Admissions Office for further information regarding the approval process.
- c. Science: All applicants planning to enroll in university-level science courses are advised that as a prerequisite they are required to take those sciences to completion in their high school programs. Grade 12 Pre-calculus Mathem

International students who wish to have their correspondence from the University sent to them by courier may pay an additional non-refundable \$50 courier fee at the time of application;

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### Continuous Admissions Policy

High School students applying for the Bachelor of Arts program

St. Thomas University processes applications for the Bachelor of Arts program on a continuing basis until August 31. We will begin accepting applications from well-qualified candidates for September 2017 in October 2016. Grade 12 students who have achieved an average of 70% or higher in Grade 11 academic courses, including English, and whose Grade 12 programs satisfy the university's 1 unit /12 1\$

1. Candidates are notified of any supporting documents which may be missing.
2. Normally, Bachelor of Arts candidates will be advised of their admission status within two weeks of completing the application process.
3. A candidate admitted to the Bachelor of Arts program will be notified of their admission status within two weeks of completing the application process.
