

English as a Second Language (ESL)

English as a Second Language (ESL) courses are designed for students who are not native speakers of English. These courses provide the necessary language skills and academic preparation for students to succeed in college-level coursework. Courses are offered in both the fall and spring semesters.

ESL courses are available in two levels: ESL 173 and ESL 230. ESL 173 is the first level of instruction, focusing on basic grammar, vocabulary, and reading skills. ESL 230 is the second level, building on the skills learned in ESL 173 and emphasizing more advanced grammar, writing, and critical thinking skills.

Students who complete ESL 173 with a grade of C or better are eligible to enroll in ESL 230. Students who complete ESL 230 with a grade of C or better are eligible to enroll in college-level English courses. For more information about ESL courses, contact the ESL Center at St. Thomas University.
